

Health, Safety and Environment Policy

- Provide management and supervisory staff who are accountable for Health, Safety and Environmental activities that affect personnel and the environment.
- Provide relevant policies, procedures, systems and training to enable effective management of Health, Safety and Environmental activities.
- Establish clear targets, objectives and initiatives to improve the Health, Safety and performance on all projects.
- Provide effective consultation and communication both internally and externally for the participation in and the dissemination of Health, Safety and Environmental information.
- Actively respond and investigate all incidents, accidents and near misses in an attempt to minimise recurrence.
- Maintain the Health and Safety Management System in accordance with AS/NZS ISO 45001:2018, and Environmental Management Systems to AS/NZS ISO 14001:2015.
- Protect the environment including the prevention of pollution in the areas where we operate.
- Recognise that all employees are entitled to and responsible for contributing towards the development and continual improvement of a safe, healthy and environmentally friendly workplace.
- All employees have a responsibility to work safely, comply with all procedures and take good care of their own health, safety and the environment, and to consider the health, safety and environment of others who may be affected by their actions.
